Anddy Perdomo is a health and human services leader with 20+ years of experience overseeing programs for underserved populations, with a particular focus on addressing the racial and economic achievement gaps.

She currently serves as Assistant Vice President of Veteran Services and Economic Empowerment Initiatives at Volunteers of America-Greater New York (VOA-GNY), a 128-year-old nonprofit organization with an annual operating budget of \$150 million.

In this role, Ms. Perdomo oversees programs that focus on veterans, families seeking asylum, and workforce development. She previously held roles overseeing supportive housing for veterans and individuals living with HIV/AIDS, and at prior organizations, was responsible for a variety of economic empowerment and community development initiatives.

She is a facilitator of the VOA-GNY Frontline Leadership training, providing workshops and sharing best practices for emerging leaders in the organization. She Co-chairs the VOA-GNY Diversity Equity and Inclusion Committee.

Outside of her role at VOA-GNY, Ms. Perdomo dedicates significant time to public service and volunteerism. She serves as a surveyor for the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, traveling around the country to evaluate the quality of services for vulnerable populations and providing technical support to nonprofits struggling to meet accreditation standards. She has proudly served as a Bronx Community Board 3 member since 2015 and as Chair of the Health and Human Services Committee since 2019.

She received a proclamation from local elected officials for her work for promoting healthy lifestyles in the Bronx in 2023. She has been a member of the New York City Continuum Care Veteran Task Force since 2013 when the Task Force was established, the task force is comprised of stakeholders (City, State, Federal, and Community Partners) who coordinate and

plan around ending homelessness amongst New York City Veterans. She served as the Co-chair of the Veteran Task Force in 2023. She also serves on the Bronxcare Health Integrated Services System Inc. Board, (BLISS).

Ms. Perdomo holds a master's degree in public administration from the Metropolitan College of New York and a bachelor's degree in human services from the New York City College of Technology. She was named a "2023 Whole Health Hero" by Empire BlueCross BlueShield for her dedication to improving the financial, physical, and mental health of those in her community.
