Prior to her policy work, she practiced law for Legal Aid Services of Oregon, representing low-income individuals in landlord-tenant, domestic violence, and family law cases.

Ms. Hebb is a member of the Attorney General's Crime Victim and Survivor Services Division Advisory Committee, and is on the steering committee of the Oregon Legislative Alliance to End Violence Against Women.

Sybil has worked on domestic violence, homelessness, and housing policy issues since 2005, primarily focusing on landlord-tenant, fair housing, homelessness, discrimination, and related matters.

She has served as the primary drafter and advocacy coordinator on policy campaigns such as COVID-related eviction moratoria, rent assistance, eviction history protections, criminal history discrimination protections, just cause eviction, rent stabilization, civil rights for people experiencing homelessness, and survivor housing protections.

She is a proud member of the Advisory Board for Street Roots, Portland's award-winning weekly street newspaper, and for Oregon Consumer Justice, advancing consumer justice for all Oregonians.

Ms. Hebb received her MPA from Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government, her law degree from Lewis and Clark, Northwestern School of Law and her bachelor's degree from Brown University.
