Brittany Eltringham (she/her) joined the National Resource Center on Domestic Violence (NRCDV) in 2020 after several years of working at the local level – first in Hawai'i and later in Maryland.

In Maryland, Brittany led a residential program featuring 24-hour hotline, emergency shelter, transitional housing, rapid rehousing, and pet shelter services. As residential director, she reduced shelter rules and worked to implement a Domestic Violence Housing First approach.

Brittany brings her experience with community engagement, facilitation, racial and reproductive justice, and shelter advocacy to her work at the intersection of gendered violence, housing, and homelessness with NRCDV's Policy and Research Team and the Domestic Violence and Housing Technical Assistance Consortium (DVHTAC).

She has a BA in Psychology and Women's Studies from the University of Hawai'i and is currently based in Baltimore.
